A Note from the Artistic Director/Producer, caryn desai



Welcome to A Doll's House, Part 2 by Lucas Hnath

I would like to take a moment to remind you about or familiarize you with the original A Doll's House by Henrik Ibsen. The information below was put together by my Executive Assistant, Jordan Gohara, for a Study Guide she created for our Students to Stage education program. I thought it was worth sharing with you today.

Who is Henrik Ibsen?

March 20, 1828 - May 23, 1906

A Norwegian playwright and theatre director, he is one of the founders of modernism in theatre. Often referred to as "the father of realism" and one of the most influential playwrights of all time, Ibsen is the most frequently performed dramatist in the world after Shakespeare. He is the inspiration of many famous playwrights and novelists such as George Bernard Shaw, Oscar Wilde, Arthur Miller, and Eugene O'Neill.

Many of Henrik Ibsen's dramas were considered scandalous at the time, but heavily influenced contemporary culture. He was named one of the Four Greats, a group of the 19th century's most influential Norwegian writers. Ibsen's work often challenged societal norms and gender relations. One of the most notable pieces to do so was A Doll's House. On the 100th anniversary of his death in 2006, it became the world's most performed play. Ibsen was nominated for a Nobel Prize in Literature in 1902, 1903, and 1904.

A Controversy

At the time, women in Norway had very few rights, and societal expectations placed heavy restrictions. Women were meant to stay at home to care for their husbands and children. They were not allowed a divorce unless their husband requested one, and they were not allowed to acquire loans.

Ibsen's leading lady, Nora, went against the grain. She forged her father's signature, illegally obtaining a loan from the bank in order to save her husband's life. Her husband's reaction helps her come to the realization that she is unhappy with the role society has given her as it has left her with no choices or thoughts of her own. Nora then decides her only path to becoming her own person and forming her own opinions is to leave her husband and children. When the play premiered at the Royal Theatre in Copenhagen, Denmark on December 21, 1879, it became so controversial that it made its way into the newspapers throughout the world.

And interestingly enough, Lucas Hnath took Ibsen's story and imagined what might occur when Nora returns 15 years later. Sit back and enjoy!
